By mid-March RI was under shelter in place orders, and COYOTE decided to stop conducting our monthly street outreach or holding in-person COYOTE meetings, PEGRITV station was shut down, so we ended filming "The Good Neighbors" TV show. However COYOTE jumped into action and created an application Jot form for RI dancers/sex workers to apply for EM COVID grants, this included forging relationships with the house moms at the strip clubs to vet dancers so we could pay them out EM grants. This also included phone interviews with each sex worker we provided services to. We also had a lot of zoom calls and phone calls, to draft and applied for several grants. We were able to provide 64,500 in direct COVID assistance to RI sex workers.

COYOTE 2020 GRANT CYCLES

Round 1- COYOTE paid out 200 grants to 76 sex workers totalling 15,200

Round 2 COYOTE paid out 200 grants to 85 sex workers totaling 17,000

Round 3 COYOTE paid out 200 grants to 56 sex workers totaling 11,200

Round 4 COYOTE provided 144 sex workers with a 100 Stop & Shop gift card totaling 14,400

Round 5 COYOTE provided 47 sex workers with a 100 gift card totaling 4700

Coyote also put small amounts of cash into the accounts of incarcerated sex workers totaling 2000

COYOTE provided a total of 64,500 to sex workers in 2020

Total 2020 income for COYOTEs 85,798.69

We also created a National COVID resource guide for sex workers, and we created educational tools like our "What's Your COVID Rules?" We also continued to run our jail support/penpal program and we also put 2000 into the accounts of incarcerated sex workers so they could purchase soap to help protect themselves from COVID. We also launched a COVID survey to better understand how sex workers were experiencing COVID. We investigated barriers to COVID services, like the federal rent assistance programs. We published a couple of articles, and we drafted the first 13 chapters of our upcoming ebook. We also spend thousands of hours engaging with sex workers on social media nationwide, as well as started to prepare ourselves for the 2021 legislative session. COYOTE member Ramona launched a monthly "Healing Hustlers" online support group for sex workers with disabilities and mental health issues.
