Governor Baker **vetoed** the Prison Moratorium on August 4th. The legislature also failed to pass critical legislation that communities are depending on- including No Cost Calls.

Formerly incarcerated women are **demanding a special session** in September to **override** Baker's veto of the Prison Moratorium and pass No Cost Calls with **no amendments**.
