I have in the past with mixed results. I've been lectured about my unsafe lifestyle, etc.

Every time I have disclosed I have been met with a combination of disdain, and blame, for whatever health issue I may have been facing at the time. I endure a patronizing speech about how if I chose different work, I would

Weird energy.

My Dr figured I was a sex worker anyway

It depends. If I go to a gay clinic for treatment, they seem more understanding.
 No change to quality of care, no bad reactions, very supportive due to education done by SWOP-Seattle

I mostly only see a healthcare provider when I get tested. And I so rarely do sex work these days that when they ask if I've ever exchanged sex for money in the last 12months, the answer is usually no.

No big reaction. No change
 Not at all they were very sympathetic to my situation never judged or made me feel different as a person and my quality of health care never changed

I use the veterans affairs medical services, I feel that I would end up with severe repercussions and therefore do not discuss.

No issue disclosing or receiving treatment

With my primary long term doctor it didn't. However when I had to move due to a sick parent (to manage their health care) it was exceptionally hard to find a doctor who wouldn't pass judgment or say a completely unbelievable

My therapist supports it

They took it like a champ, no visible reaction. They just showed concern and asked some questions to make sure I was being safe.
 It doesn't seem to have changed my quality of care, and they are quite okay I think with me being a on again off again sex worker

I've always gone to clinics, and they were always cool about it. I don't think I was treated very differently, except I probably got more std checks than other people.
 Planned parenthood is the only one I told and they were extremely supportive

Unfazed.
 They understood and allowed me extra access to testing

I've had bad experiences of course, but even if they are positive about sw, it often feels like I spend my time educating my doctors and it can be exhausting.
 Before I left the industry, I saw LGBT providers and was open with them about my history. I would not at Kaiser, my current healthcare provider.

I've been treated poorly by medical professionals who lumped all attending clientele into "high risk addict" status or outright behaved as though the medical reason I sought help had anything to do with sex work (completely

I fully disclosed my sexual history with my providers and admitted to being a survival sex worker in the past.

I know my therapist knows but that's who I generally see

They would treat me like I was on drugs not and that I'm probably diseased I'm not. Stigmatized for like a street walker

I only disclose this info when medically necessary. There have been a few cases where they gave me lectures on the dangers of sw, but none have refused care.

Never told

Bad

I think they were mostly surprised that I admitted I was in the sex industry, but they treated me with care all the same.

They were surprised but non-judgmental.

With all the legality bullshit you will not convince many sex workers to be upfront and disclose. Legalize it and stop the stigma.

They did not react in any special way and the quality of care only increased because they better know how to care for me.

Not go to a LGBT community health clinic and they are so positive and welcoming to sex workers

Disclosing that I'm a sex worker improved my quality of care because we could address my specific health needs as a sex worker

No better and no worse.

It varied but when it was not positive it affected the quality of care

They would try and shame and control my sexual activities. My body, doing what I want with it. Body control is oppressive and anti feminist.

I had one bad reaction and just got a new Dr. But other than that, they have been professional about it.

Some are rude, others are not

I have told my providers that I am in open relationships/multiple sex partners. I have only disclosed being a sex worker at the city clinic of SF.

When I first mentioned my sex work status at the clinic where I was getting my gynecological check up, I just felt like it was a worse experience than it should have been and she was really rough with my exam. She could be generally people seem to not believe me

I don't know. I wish someone would try to say something but it's none of their business anyways so unless it is the core reason of my visit it does not need to be disclosed

They were very accepting.

They don't believe me at first. I am a well spoken white British woman - I don't fit their image of what sex workers in the south look like.

I go to a gyno that specializes with sex workers, he is in porn or full service

I told my ex, dentist and therapist not primary care

I'm not sure how relevant this is to strippers but I do feel so ashamed to tell them. They may lecture me on how much I drink

I was with my sister, who's a stripper, once, at our mutual doctor's, and when she disclosed her line of work, he got judgy as hell

Most have been fine but one female doctor at a clinic got an attitude and was rough during the exam. I complained about her and I fired her.

Not the current provider I have but I did in the past. They where very agitated with me.

The real answer to #72 is - sometimes.

No. I was fortunate to have see-worker friendly providers most of the time.
I have not, but... Once, actually before I started sex work, I was slut shamed when I went to urgent care for a strep throat. I had insisted on additional testing just to be on the safe side, and after a lot of specific questions about

There are just too many close minded people that I keep it to myself mainly

In most cases, neutral to positive, often resulting in more comprehensive and targeted care. Occasionally passively negative, which did not reduce quality of care, but discouraged honesty.

It did not affect anything physiological because I do nonphysical sex work (porn / online webcam stuff only)

They were open minded and helpful. Especially at St. James, which is SF clinic specifically for SWS.

No reaction.

I see it Nevada and the brothels here are legal and so they see a high number of brothel workers. They treat us like normal clients.

Understanding. Thank God.

If I do get health care, it's at the Life Foundation, Honolulu's HIV/AIDS experts. They are peer-led and open-minded. Honesty enhances the care.

I told my therapist and she was really weird about it and tried to talk me into quitting as if getting another job was a thing I could do easily. I stopped seeing her. I haven't told my doctor.

No reaction

my clinician was kind, compassionate and praised me for choosing to use condoms for oral sex when I work.

He could tell, it didn't change

She has been lovely about it

They acted professionally

My md is amazing and supportive! She shared that I am not the first sw she has had as a patient. She encourages best practices without being judgemental

I feel like they would think that means I am promiscuous but I am not full service and I have been in a 5 year monogamous relationship

They reacted neutrally but I felt it was not something they thought highly of

It was fine

More understanding than me being trans, generally

They wanted to know more information both as a provider and to provide better educational info to others

Nothing changed except I went on PEP, my request, and I discussed with my doc my techniques, etc., safe sex, yadda yadda. I'm a PP certified sex-educator and feel pretty confident, but I still love a good safer sex chat.

None really, I go to an LGBTQ health center

I don't know.

Specifically, I go to Planned Parenthood for CBQ/OTN services. They are very non judgmental and helpful in terms of education and risks.

I think that people who want to quit they don't most of the times. I don't want to quit, but I know people who do. They are afraid. That they won't make ends meet. But they are more afraid of the stigma that comes with sex work. Not having other options is a barrier to leaving survival sex work. An individual wanting to leave sex work might want or need training in an alternate field and enough money to survive until that alternative can provide for them. Its easy money and when that's the only skill someone feels like they are good at its hard to stray away from what helps you eat everyday. Assistance programs for skills and trades can help many people who would like to get out of the industry.

It's hard to leave because of how quickly you can make money. I think it would be easier to leave the industry if the skills we have from sex work could be used as valid experience in traditional jobs. For example, website design. We aren't able to collect pensions, 401K's, or retirement plans. We should be educated on programs that can assist us to save our money for a long term benefit like such. There are not many job openings for people who are over 40.

We get spoiled by the money and the freedom. We also tend to have gaps on our resume that can't be explained. I'm not sure what could be done for people who want to leave... career counseling or access to other job opportunities.

The money, lack of resources

the money is inconsistent but good enough that I don't have to suffer in the service industry or teaching full time for pennies, my mental health can take being assaulted but not the amount of labor I have to do in other jobs like

Reduce stigma, increase wages, better assistance with getting records expunged.

Job history gaps has been my biggest struggle. Also, a lack of knowing how to navigate the job market outside of menial labor. It would great to have mentorship or internship programs for sex workers who are trying to transition.

People don't want to leave because of the money and security they get by doing it. It may be difficult or have some dry spells but the money is worth it, and most are in it because of the flexibility no schedule, being your own boss.

They don't have other skills, the amount of money they'd get wouldn't compare, they don't think about their futures. Make it legal so that they can save and retire or justify their income and invest somewhere else without being judged.

More education and less stigma would make it easier to leave the sex industry. Job placement.

You need to discern between trafficked sex workers and those who choose to. I.e. Legal citizens over 18 years old with no pimp. For those who choose sex work I think it is the earning potential in comparison to legal work.

Why would you want sex workers who are happy doing it to leave? Why force your views on others. If you don't like it don't get into it but make it legal for the ones who want it. Not everyone sees things the way you do.

Lack of living wages and healthcare, student debt, lack of family financial support, poverty.

Stigma, creates sex worker-run exit programs that are non judgemental.

Abolish capitalism.

Money and skillsets, so, increasing wages especially for low-skill jobs, and easier access to affordable school or other types of skills opportunities. But also, just like for kids, it's important to offer community-based initiatives.

Most people don't leave the industry because they don't want to. It's a great job, with great pay, and little work hours needed. That freedom of time is almost impossible to find in any other profession.

Need better wages, supportive programs overall.

Better wages and better jobs, employment security.

Stigma makes it hard... economics... higher wages including living wage, educate public, decriminalize.

The money, the belonging to something, they cannot leave whether it be family/children threat of harm to same.

It is difficult to go back to "the real world" when you have been off the radar for so long. No resume is a huge problem. I think that workshops on how to turn your cash into a legit verifiable source of income/job on paper would help.

Everything else pays less or they can't be hired for reasons of Disability.

It's hard to adjust to not getting paid every day, even if it's just a few dollars. It feels like you're in control.

It can be hard readjusting to "regular" work (hours, wages etc). More support, motivation, career guidance.

Money management.

Folks in the industry can't put this on their resume but honestly sex work teaches you a lot about customer service, marketing, money management. But they can't put any of that on their resume and a career change is hard.

School is very expensive and school loans make paying for rent hard.

Other options to work elsewhere are terrible, mental health issues.

Making a living wage if reason.

sex work isn't acceptable to report as a job in the US, even though there are many transferable skills, with a gap in "real work" employers wonder what you were doing and don't think you are eligible or competent enough to get a job.

Harassment in other industries and horrible wages. Resources to get better jobs as well as job protections and wages that are enough so you can actually feed your family.

Stigma. Shame. Lack of well paying jobs for women with limited education.

There aren't enough options for earning a living wage, particularly in the Bay area.

The inelastic pay. It would help if minimum wage was a livable one. A lot. And there were fewer hoops to jump through to get on disability. Many people I know can't get the disability checklist done because they're too afraid of criminal background checks. Excuses. Remove excises and prostitution charges from background checks for employment, then a lot more sex workers could apply. Also, for trans women, sex work is often their only option.

Stigma of sex work, living wages in other jobs.

It is hard to find another job when we have to hide our past and explain what looks like a lack of employment. And it is hard to find other jobs that pay as well and are as flexible, for those of us who can't manage a regular job.

Better job options.

The pay is better than most other jobs, including good ones. My ex-husband currently pays child support, but he will not once our kid is of college age; all that expense will fall on my shoulders. I - and my kid - would account for criminal records, discrimination and poverty make it impossible to get out.

What's next? We need opportunities where we can grow. Not some lame job that there is no upper mobility. I think sex workers can benefit from entrepreneurship classes we have money and are used to being our own boss.

Such a good question. I mentioned earlier that the reason I went back to the industry was because the money was unbeatable, so that's definitely something that keeps people from leaving.

People in the industry who want to leave do it to make money. The standards for disabled people and minimum wages need to change so that only people who love to do sex work can do it.

Hard to leave: flexibility of hours, ability to be own boss, potential to learn how to run a kick ass business. What could be done: vocational training & job placements to ease transition.

I think there should be special groups and programs for people wanting to leave the industry safely.

First recognize and respect that sex work may be the best work the woman has ever had. Don't assume that everyone involved in sex work wants to leave it. Second of all provide options that allow the sexworker to leave an industry.

Stigma and lack of economic viability.

You can't just leave the sex biz and then go work somewhere for minimum wage. You would have to be crazy to do that. It just sucks. Raise the minimum wage to a livable wage, make it more easy and affordable for people to transition.

The money, the thrill, the like minded people, the crutch of feeling unskilled for other work. How to help leave the industry? Mental health services and adequate resources for higher education, job retraining.

Because late stage capitalism is literally killing people who can't get good enough jobs to afford to exist. We need to rework everything.

Scared they no nothing else lack of support

Not enough planning for retiring from the industry. Not enough opportunities to report and invest the income from SW. No access to retirement funds. No plans for the future and older age
 laziness, greed and lack of education.
 Stigma of being a sex worker makes it challenging to get a job outside of the industry. Removing the stigma perpetuated about sexworkers would make the transition easier.

Lost income and barriers to entry to living-wage jobs and basic needs. Provide free or low-cost higher education and job training (NOT in domestic or textile industries), provide material benefits to compensate for lost income.

You will never make as much money doing some lame boring job. You don't need a college education to be a sex worker. It is easy money if you are good at what you do.

fighting for jobs that can actually pay the bills
 the inability to make a living wage makes it incredibly hard to leave. Having jobs that pay a living wage without having to work 70 hours a week is a good start.

Money and gender identity – the women I know who are most at risk in the sex trade are homeless and transgender and have to survive on a day to day basis. Long term shelters and the decriminalization of sex work would
 Raise the minimum wage and create better work conditions as well as better welfare systems especially for the physically disabled and non-neurotypical.

When you enter sex work, you now have a gap on your resume that you can't explain. You won't be able to get a job in the US without a continuous, relevant resume. There isn't really a path to leave sex work because it is so

Money, stability, quick money, and the fact that no one really hires former sex workers. I think more organizations should exist to help current worker and workers trying to exit the industry seek employment. It can be hard for

Money is the main thing he seen, have a more reachable support network that shows how to be able to achieve similar or better financial success outside industry

Eradicating trafficking would make leaving the sex industry as easy as swytjob. Stressful, but normal.

Stigma against sex work!!!! We have to have years of no work history on our resumes because no one will hire a sex worker. Also the economy is shit, jobs don't pay enough. That's bigger than sex work though.

The stigma we face from people who judge our choices (or lack thereof) as the biggest barrier most sex workers face when leaving the industry. The stigma is greatest for full service sex workers, but even as an online only it's Stigma and wages. Sex work usually pays better and is more accommodating of minorities than other industries with entry level positions. We need higher minimum wage, better paying jobs in general and less discrimination.

The stigma is what makes it most hard. It's hard for people to return to a regular job when the judgement remains. Society needs to see sex workers as people who matter.

After making upwards of \$500 an hour, going to a minimum wage job seems unthinkable to me. What makes leaving the industry hard is how lucrative it is. Additionally, the stigma is a huge factor. Our culture is not forgiving.

Easy, quick cash/payments keeps some involved. Nothing needs to be done to help people leave any industry. It is a personal choice unless they are being forced/coerced. If the person is being taken advantage of, they're discriminated against those who have done sex work in the past makes it difficult for former sex workers to leave the industry.

If you're seeking future employment and they look at previous work history you usually have to have some sort of backstory for your time in the industry, if something shows up and they see that you were in sex work they can

Money. You can't make money this easily and legally in any other field. People want to live and minimum wage isn't supporting a lifestyle above poverty for many families.

Stigma creates isolation. Even though what I do is completely legal, it would be very hard for me to re-enter the workforce if I wanted to because I cannot disclose my job history. I have a HUGE number of skills I've learned and

Whether they're making just enough or are living it large, the income isn't available in too many other places, and there is always a demand for sex work.

It's an industry that's always in need - people love sex and if they want it, they'll pay for it until they're broke. It's an easy way to make money as a young woman and, if done correctly, you can make A LOT of money. Minimum wage is unlivable and many sex workers don't have other work experience, classes and certifications would help women leave the industry.

People that enter the industry don't understand how to manage their money. They end up spending it all and not planning for the future. They're left with no career when they get older and no way of making or saving money.

Listen to their needs and see what is necessary. Prepare yourself for the fact they might not want to leave the industry.

I think providing jobs that pay a living wage would stop women who choose sex work as a last resort leave the industry. I enjoy my job as a sex worker but I wouldn't be doing it if it wasn't as profitable as a regular job. I would

some are illegal immigrants and find it very hard to find a more legit job, some, primarily transwomen, have a difficult time finishing education and getting "legit" jobs - help those people by offering more aid and training plus

We face being arrested even for those like myself that are consensual

Dehumanization

No legal recourse to report crimes, impossible to work in community with people without them being at risk for aiding in "trafficking", no trust for police.

Non consensual sex work.

Rapes, assaults, sometimes killings

We get raped and robbed a lot but they never care about that

Assaults, rape

Assault, robbery, stalking/harassment.

Violence and theft.

Cops are the primary danger faced by sex workers. They abuse sex workers without consequence due to unrestricted power over them.

Law enforcement is the greatest threat to providers.

The call is coming from inside the house.

We want to be able to advertise, screen, and work together in safe locations

Law enforcement are not there to assist or protect sex workers. What do they need to be concerned with? How about not locking people up and causing misery for people who are only trying to live, in order to get a state star

A major issue is law enforcement itself.

I think as long as nobody is getting hurt, the law enforcement shouldn't be concerned. They should take stalking/assault on Sex Workers more seriously.

Being sexually assaulted by clients because the client knows that the worker cannot report it.

Assault, robbery, murder, kidnapping at the hands of predators pretending to be clients.

Getting killed by ticks

The law enforcement itself is the only risk I face. Adults have the complete capacity of evaluating risk, managing it, and avoiding it. Is not the states responsibility to take care of me. If I miscalculate risk and end up harmed, I

we are at risk because we are a highly stigmatized group. If people think we are disposable because of what we do then we become targets of abuse.

As long as sex work is not legal we are at risk for everything.

My friend doesn't want to drive me for legality so I have to take a risk going by myself. Tell that to law enforcement. Laws are STUPID make it legal! END the bullshit!

We risk constant assault, robbery, stalking, loss of basic needs when we don't have protections.

extreme prejudice from all aspects of society

Trust, in terms of interpersonal as well as legal relationships - if victims believe they will be treated as victims, they will be more likely to seek help - and they will be more likely to feel safe creating rules and filters on their client

I haven't faced any problems or risks.

Law enforcement is a big risk

Domestic abuse - extortion, robbery/theft, rape (by clients/policia/etc) exploitation, stigma

Law Enforcement really has no reason and does not care

robbery, rape, assault, stalking, identity theft, kidnapping

Assault from clients, addiction and assault from police

rape, robbery, coercion

Violence and abuse due to the stigmatization and criminalization of sex workers. Their lives are less worthy.

The johns

Abusive clients or robbers or people who scam us out of our wages or rapists but we can't go to the police for any of that

Blackmail domestic violence robbery assault

Being outed, arrested, potentially not being able to find a job

They make bogus charges to harm DWS for no reason. Not to help but to hurt those who are independent and want to do this work.

rape, violence, coercion

Sexual harassment and assault from law enforcement. We're more at risk a lot of the time because we're trying to prevent being arrested, or because our clients are trying to, which leads to us doing stuff that's more dangerous

Rape and theft. And homelessness.

Prohibition makes girls afraid to come forward when they are victims of crimes. Also, the police force doesn't see any humanity in us. We're all dogs to them. We're the most at risk because no one cares if anything happens.

Unreported crimes, rape, robbery, assault

Violence, theft, being exploited by people who know we won't retaliate, unsafe conditions, etc. Being afraid to carry condoms because of "condoms as evidence" laws.

Obviously, some people target sex workers for crimes because they know we are unlikely to report them. We would report crimes if we thought we would be listened to or respected.

Not being able to report rape and robbery allows men to continue to do this to other sex workers

Scared to report crimes. Operating alone

I think LEO already knows the risks (increased stalking/harassment if you work from home, violence from partners when you don't make money, higher risk of suicide, etc etc etc), they just don't give a shit. About half of my friends

on the street level- being raped by the police, in the club, management exploiting & firing & firing us for random shit all the time.
physical and sexual violence from law enforcement lack of recourse in the face of sexual and physical violence or theft from clients or law enforcement. lack of safe working conditions due to the criminalized nature of prostitution
Assault, murder, and police harassment
Most of the risks we face come directly from law enforcement. If we weren't criminals for existing then maybe we could get some justice for the violence against us, sometimes from police officers themselves.
The illegal nature of the work (which is rooted in puritanical b.s.) makes it impossible seek help from law enforcement or the courts in pursuit of charges against clients who steal, rape, or commit violence against a sex-worker
